Former Obama Climate Director to grow U.S. operations of Pollination

Former Energy and Climate Change Senior Director in the Obama Administration, John E Morton, has joined new global firm, Pollination.

John brings more than twenty-five years experience in emerging markets, investment finance, and economic and environmental policy. A former private equity investor, he was a Presidential Appointee in the Obama Administration and served in a variety of roles including as White House Senior Director for Energy and Climate Change at the National Security Council.

Earlier in the Administration, Mr. Morton served for nearly six years as Vice President for Investment Policy, Chief of Staff and Chief Operating Officer of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC). At OPIC, John managed the Agency's \$20 billion investment portfolio in over 100 countries. He spearheaded the growth of the Agency's activities in renewable energy and natural resources.





Most recently, John was architect and coordinator of the Climate Finance Partnership (CFP) - a first-of-its-kind emerging markets climate investment fund that has brought together the Governments of France and Germany, a group of leading global philanthropies, and BlackRock, the world's largest asset manager.

"At Pollination, I look forward to working with partners in designing and implementing the next generation of investment solutions," John said.
